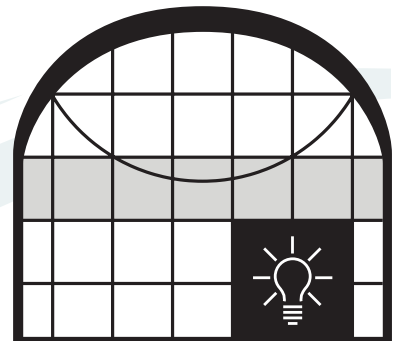
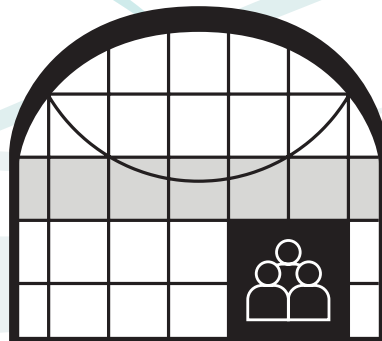
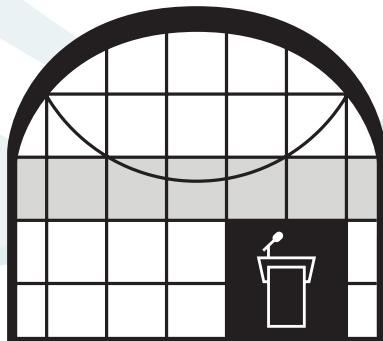
INTENDED AUDIENCE & SCOPE OF PRACTICE
